

TINTALDRA HOTEL

Freshly shucked oysters are not something that feature on the menu of many venues so far inland! Guests at the Tintaldra Hotel are spoilt on weekends, with the owner of the venue hand-delivering fresh oysters from Pambula. But you will need to be fast because they are snapped up very auickly!

If the Hotel walls could talk, there would be many a story, as the Tintaldra Hotel was the first pub on the Murray River when it began trading in 1870. Known locally as the 'Tinpot', visitors can enjoy the sweeping views of the Murray River, with the owners daring guests to find a colder beer. The hotel's curry nights are a firm favourite with locals and guests. Basic accommodation is provided within the hotel, with many visitors also enjoying the free onsite camp facilities located near the expansive beer garden.

TOOMA INN

Sweet tooths beware, the Tooma Inn has a lolly bar that would rival Willy Wonka's Chocolate Factory! There are chocolates, lollies and ice-creams galore within this historic pub. The recently opened lolly bar and gift shop has proved a welcome addition to the venue which was previously known as the Tooma Hotel and first opened in 1879. Featuring all Australian products, the gift shop also sells travelling essentials, such as dishwashing liquid and small goods including jams, chutneys, relishes and rubs. The Tooma Inn has a huge reputation for its quality menu, from Thai chicken and lychee curry, through to lamb shanks and homemade rissoles, pork chops, seafood baskets and bacon and egg rolls. The outdoor entertaining area has a barbecue and is large enough to host a gathering of more than 200 people. Free camping is available onsite and quests are welcome to park their caravans on the half acre block surrounding the venue with its picturesque views. Basic accommodation is also provided within the Tooma Inn.



KHANCOBAN ALPINE INN

You will be greeted with a cold beer and a warm smile on arrival at the Khancoban Alpine Inn. The family-friendly venue is a favourite with visitors to the area partaking in mountain adventures such as fishing, mountain bike riding or snow fun at nearby skiing destinations. Nestled in the foothills of the Snowy Mountains, the 36-room hotel features a pool and is the only venue in town that serves meals seven days a week. Warm open fires in the winter are welcomed and in the hotter months the cool outdoor beer garden provides a shady delight. Hearty pub meals are on offer in the bistro, with even the youngest members of the family being well catered for with the extensive kids' menu. Patrons can choose indoor or outdoor dining, with local and boutique beers on tap and a comprehensive wine list featuring local wines. If it's not a meal you are after, why not pop in for some dessert and a night cap?







KOETONG PUB

With an illustrious history, story has it, the Koetong Pub started out as an illegal wine shanty back in the 1800s, when tin mining was booming within the area. These days, the iconic pub is a great stop for visitors, particularly those enjoying the nearby High Country Rail Trail.

With exceptional customer service and a focus on using as much local produce as possible, the food is revered as some of the best in the district. Local jams, relishes, chutneys and honey are not only used in the restaurant, but are also on sale for visitors. Homemade sweets are a crowd pleaser and the locally sourced coffee from Mt Beauty is highly recommended. With views across the pastures and farmland, the large beer garden provides a relaxing and chilled vibe. A self-contained flat is available for accommodation and camping could soon be a possibility.

BRIDGE HOTEL JINGELLIC

The Jingellic Pub is not just a pub, it's a destination. Located on the banks of the iconic Murray River, the Jingellic Pub is a thriving hub of locals, travellers and campers.

The free camping facility below the pub draws the crowds, with free showers at the back of the pub's beer garden an added bonus. Campers arrive early to grab the best spots and enjoy the food and beverages of the Hotel knowing that their bed is a stone's throw away.

Accommodation within the pub itself is also available, as well as a cabin and holiday house. Guests won't know what to choose from with the extensive menu featuring endless options including traditional Chicken Parmigiana and Reef and Beef, right through to daily specials, but the highly popular BBQ Bourbon Pork Ribs can't be overlooked!





THE WALWA HOTEL

Oozing charm and character, the Walwa Hotel has seen generations of locals and visitors frequent this watering hold since its establishment in 1926. The large beer garden is dog-friendly with water bowls and other special touches to make your canine friend's stay as happy as yours. Ice cold beers and an extensive wine list featuring local drops complement the extensive menu of traditional pub grub. Travellers, local workers, motorbike and cycling groups love taking advantage of the great location of the hotel for both dining and accommodation (six rooms available). In the spirit of genuine country hospitality, during the winter the owners keep the wood burner firing inside.

Built in 1921, the Hotel Cudgewa is only 12 km from Corryong and offers a tasty range of home-cooked meals on Fridays from 2-11pm. They pride themselves on the quality of their traditional country meals, made from fresh ingredients and featuring local produce. The hotel provides comfortable Bed and Breakfast accommodation with full cooked breakfasts included. There is plenty of open garden space, a fire pit and an outdoor seating area to enjoy. Self-contained motor homes are also happily accommodated. Functions are a specialty - the hotel is a perfect spot for a country weekend escape. Packages are tailored to your needs and their packed lunches and delicious hampers are a real treat. Nearby attractions include Burrowa-Pine Mountain National Park and Cudgewa Bluff Falls. Take in the gorgeous scenery on a bike ride along some of the peaceful local roads or try your luck fishing the Cudgewa Creek.





CORRYONG COURTHOUSE HOTEL

Known affectionately as the 'Top Pub', a visit to the historic Corryong Courthouse Hotel is like taking a step back in time mixed with High Country hospitality and mouthwatering meals. The original old staircase winding through the building and welcoming fireplace sets the scene for a relaxing meal, drink or catch up. The beer garden provides the perfect backdrop on those warmer days, while the sweeping verandah around the hotel takes you to a bygone era. The extensive menu caters for all tastebuds and age brackets with a designated children's menu right through to a seniors' menu for those quests wanting something a little smaller. The historic function room can be used for a variety of get-togethers and the TAB located within the hotel is a welcome addition. Don't be fooled by the historic building facade with the accommodation wing featuring clean fresh rooms with ensuite facilities.
